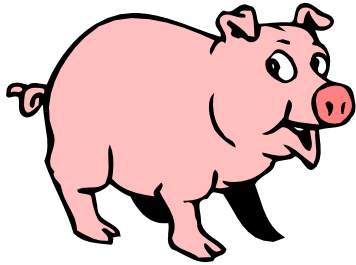

1. Exhibition Hall will be open for those entering exhibits from 5 to 8 PM on Tuesday and from 8 to 10 AM on Wednesday. One entry per person per category. *(All exhibitors welcome, not restricted to Monmouth residents.)*

2. All exhibits from the Exhibition Hall must be picked up Sunday between 8 and 11:30 AM. No exhibit shall be removed from the Exhibition Hall prior to Sunday morning without the express permission from the Supt. of Hall or the Supt. of Arts and Crafts.

3. The Association will furnish suitable glass show cases for all exhibits of cooking.

4. Under Class I and II no one article can be entered for more than one premium.

5. Items in Class VI and VII must have been crafted within 24 months and not previously exhibited at Monmouth Fair.

6. Any person entering borrowed vegetables or any other exhibit or making fraudulent representations in reference to his/her entry, will forfeit all premiums that may be awarded. The decision of the judges shall be final.

7. Exhibits delivered and placed the day previous to the fair will be protected by a night watchman.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. All Premiums from the Cochnewagan Agricultural Association will be paid within 60 days from the date of the Fair.

2. If the Fair income receipts are not enough to pay the premiums they will be paid pro rata to receipts.

3. In case of extreme weather conditions the Superintendent of Halls may close the building for a period of time for the protections of the exhibits & displays.

Rules & Regulations:

All Pies must be in a disposable pie pan.

The Pie must be a two-crust pie. Recipes must be cooked as submitted.

Recipe must accompany the entry.

There cannot be any other fruit in the pie.

Pies are judged on appearance, preparation & taste

Appearance: Overall eye appeal, uniformity of shape, color, and appearance of the crust.

Taste: Crust and filling will be judged separately.

Flavor & consistency will be judged.

Preparation: Will be determined from the written recipe.

Other things considered will be ease of preparing the recipe and how clearly the recipe ingredients and instructions are written.

Please: Only one entry per household will be accepted.

Note: After being judged, entries in this contest become sold by the slice.

D-31 KID'S BLUEBERRY MUFFIN CONTEST Open to youth, 12 years old and under Sponsored by Countryside Child Care Premium: 1st \$12 • 2nd \$8 • 3rd \$5 Submit a plate of 4 muffins for this contest **Note: Only one entry per household will be accepted for this contest.**

RECIPE: In a medium mixing bowl, combine:

1 egg, 1/3 cup sugar, ¼ cup oil, 1 cup milk &
1 tablespoon lemon juice

In a small bowl, combine:

Two cups flour, ½ tsp. salt, 2 tsp. baking powder

Add to wet mixture, just until moistened. Batter should be lumpy.

Fold in ¾ cup of blueberries.

Fill greased muffin pan 2/3's full.

Bake at 350 degrees until toothpick inserted comes out dry, Approximately 15-20 minutes.

Note: Parental supervision is recommended when using hot oven.
